

5 DAYS 4 NIGHTS IN ARGENTINA BUENOS AIRES: USHUAIA + CALAFATE

ITINERARY

DAY 1

BUENOS AIRES TO CALAFATE

Fly from Buenos Aires to Calafate in the morning. Upon arrival, transfer to the hotel.

DAY 2

VISIT TO LOS GLACIARES NATIONAL PARK



LOS GLACIARES NATIONAL PARK is home to 47 glaciers, with the most famous being **GLACIER PERITO MORENO**. Covering an area of 257 square kilometers, it is one of the three largest glaciers in the world and one of the few still advancing.



The view from the specially constructed viewing platforms allows visitors to see how the glacier cascades down from the snowy peaks. The glacier's face is straight and sharp, with numerous cracks that reflect light in a spectrum of colors. From the viewing platforms, visitors can often hear the deep, rumbling sounds of ice breaking off the glacier



COPTIONAL ACTIVITY

GLACIER WALKING (MINITREKKING)



Prior to visiting LOS GLACIARES NATIONAL PARK, guests can book a glacier walking experience. This unforgettable journey starts with a boat ride to the glacier's edge, followed by a 20-minute walk to the glacier. After a brief safety and technique briefing, guests will spend approximately one hour walking on the glacier. The ice surface is irregular but solid and safe. After the walk, enjoy lunch before returning to the viewing platforms to admire the Perito Moreno Glacier. Departure from the park and return to El Calafate. Note: This activity is only available during Argentina's summer season



NOTE: This activity is only available during Argentina's summer season (August to May). It is of moderate difficulty, suitable for healthy individuals aged 10 to 65. Not recommended for those overweight (more than twice their height), pregnant women, those with mobility issues, or those with old leg injuries. Comfortable, warm clothing, windproof and waterproof jackets, hiking shoes, sunglasses, sunscreen, gloves, and a sun hat are recommended.

DAY 3



Cruise to Upsala and Spegazzini Glaciers

In the morning, we will travel to Puerto Bandera, located 47 kilometers from Calafate, and embark on a cruise to navigate the northern arm of Lake Argentino. We will sail through the **Devil's Mouth** into the Upsala Canal, surrounded by massive icebergs from the **Upsala Glacier**. Next, we will enter the **Spegazzini Canal**, where we will admire the **Dry Glacier**, **Heim Sur Glacier**, and **Peineta Glacier**.

We will disembark at the **Spegazzini** base and walk along a 300-meter trail to the **Spegazzini Viewpoint**, where we can enjoy panoramic views of the glacier bay. At this unique retreat, you can have lunch, visit the shop, or simply relax and take in the scenery.

For hiking enthusiasts, there is a moderately challenging mountain trail with natural viewpoints and impressive scenery, culminating at the disembarkation point.

DAY 4





El Calafate to Ushuaia Morning transfer to the airport for a flight to Ushuaia, the southernmost city in the world. Transfer from Ushuaia airport to the hotel for luggage storage. Free time in the morning.

In the afternoon, take a yacht tour through the famous **Beagle Channel**, which separates Chile and Argentina. Named after the 19th-century ship "**HMS Beagle**", which Charles Darwin sailed on during his second voyage, the channel divides the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. The calm, clear waters are flanked by snow-capped peaks and stunning scenery. Continue the tour to visit islands such as Seal Island, Bird Island, where penguins, sea lions, sea dogs, and various birds reside, and see the iconic "End of the World" lighthouse.

DAY 5





Visit to Tierra del Fuego National Park, return to Buenos Aires In the morning, explore Tierra del Fuego National Park, the southernmost national park in the world, known for its natural beauty, with snow-capped peaks, mountains, lakes, and forests. View ancient indigenous shelters and the picturesque landscapes, vibrant with wildlife and rare birds. In autumn, the hills are covered in brilliant red foliage. Visitors can take a scenic train ride to the world's southernmost train station and explore the southernmost road, Route 3, and the southernmost freshwater lake. In the afternoon, transfer to the airport for a flight back to Buenos Aires.
